Success Story: Keith Williams

At 30 years old, Keith Williams was ready for more than just a steady paycheck. With experience in manufacturing, warehouse, and retail, he became interested un union construction for its structure and long-term benefits. After struggling to navigate the application process into trades programs, he connected with HIRE360 for guidance.

Through test prep, financial literacy training, and career coaching, Keith gained the tools he needed to succeed. He was recently accepted into the <u>Bricklayers Union</u> and is preparing to begin his apprenticeship. "They really care," he says. "They'll help you get what you're worth."

Success Story: Miguel Alquisira

Miguel Alquisira, 30, grew up working summers with his father and uncle as a drywall hanger/taper in Chicago's Hermosa neighborhood. Though he enrolled at the <u>University of Illinois at Chicago</u>, Miguel quickly realized that traditional classroom learning wasn't the right fit. After nearly a decade working in construction, he connected with HIRE360, where he received trade certifications, test prep, and financial support.

<u>Council</u> and <u>Heat & Frost Insulators Local 17</u>. Now living in Pilsen, he is focused on building long-term stability. "HIRE360 gave me the tools and confidence I needed to grow," he says.

A major milestone in Central Illinois: <u>Illinois Central College</u> has graduated its second cohort of the <u>Climate Works</u> Pre-Apprenticeship Program. This time, ten individuals completed the program, each one ready to take the next step in their careers.

These graduates gained more than just hands-on training. Donald Noordhof and Leonard Peoples have been accepted into the <u>Mid-America Carpenters Regional Council</u> Apprenticeship Program, with Leonard preparing to work with the <u>Peoria Housing</u> <u>Authority</u>. Keith Donley is set to begin his apprenticeship after completing 270 work hours with SLR Solar. Brian Duncan, who was also accepted into the Carpenters Union, is currently working with <u>SLR Solar</u>.

Belvidere Pre-Apprenticeship Earth Day Cleanup

Students in our <u>Climate Works</u> Pre-Apprenticeship Program, delivered in partnership with <u>Goodwill Industries of Northern Illinois</u>, marked Earth Day with a community cleanup in Belvidere! This was part of day two of the program, which offers 190 hours of Multi-Craft Core Curriculum (MC3) instruction, hands-on experiences with <u>Habitat for Humanity</u>, tours of local training centers, and work readiness training.

Offered in both Rockford and Belvidere, Climate Works prepares participants to launch careers in the clean energy and construction industries. After graduation, HIRE360 case managers work individually with students to help them take their next steps into apprenticeships or employment opportunities.

frameworks for buildings and bridges; reinforcing steel placement - installing rebar
and other reinforcements in concrete structures; bridgework - constructing and
maintaining bridges; rigging - safely moving heavy equipment and materials;
precast concrete structures - assembling pre-made concrete components; tower
cranes - assembling and disassembling cranes used in construction. Applications

Iron Workers Local 63:

• Architectural Iron Workers perform field fabrication & Installation of: window walls, glass and metal rails, curtain walls, storefronts, glass and metals, door hardware, stairs, scaffolds, chain link fences, faire escapes, flag poles, guard rails, canopies & playground equipment, skylights & vault doors and adjacent supports

Glaziers:

• Glaziers are certified in shielded metal arc welding. Their work includes installing storefront framing, curtain walls, unitized systems, metal doors, glass doors, door hardware, automatic doors, glass panels, glass railings, skylight systems, insulated glass, photovoltaic glass, shower doors, and glass in wood, metal or composite frames. Applications are open.

The apprentice program is five years in duration, and is registered with the U.S. Department of Labor, Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training. The program consists of on-the-job training provided by union electrical contractors, and related classroom instruction.

City of Chicago Laborers Trainee Program

HIRE360 recently gathered with nearly 70 future trainees at City Hall for an energizing information session about the <u>City of Chicago</u> Laborers Trainee Program. Each candidate received a branded hard hat provided by <u>Laborers Local 1001</u>, and learned about the paid summer opportunity ahead, including how to apply, what to expect during training, and the pathway to full-time employment with the City.

The Laborer's Trainee Program is a 10-week, paid summer experience for graduating

seniors interested in a hands-on career with the <u>Department of Streets and Sanitation</u>. Participants receive two weeks of training at the <u>LIUNA</u> Chicagoland Laborers' Training Fund facility followed by on-the-job experience across various city divisions. They'll complete 120 hours of training, gain safety certifications, and develop employability skills, with the potential to bid for a full-time role by the end of the program.

With HIRE360's support, these students are preparing not just for summer jobs, but for lasting careers serving and strengthening Chicago.
